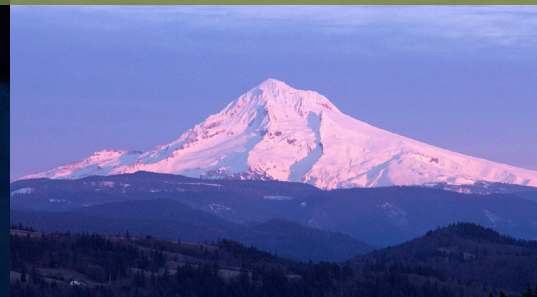

Course Overview

This is the 9th annual course designed to provide practicing surgeons an opportunity to learn the latest developments in minimally invasive surgery and surgical flexible endoscopy. This year our focus is on “tips and tricks” applicable to operations performed everyday. The lectures are aimed at providing practical skills from surgeons who have a high volume practice in each particular area. **Participants will experience didactics, live surgery, bench top skills on day one. Day two is designed to provide high impact lectures followed immediately by hands-on animate and/or cadaver labs to test the new skills and use the latest equipment.** Participants will have opportunities for direct one on one interaction with the faculty and open forum for questions throughout is the norm. As always, the latest technologies will be available for demonstration and trials.

Upon completion of this course, the participant should be able to:

- Obtain laparoscopic access safely
- Consider various laparoscopic specimen extraction sites
- Explain key steps for implantation of mesh in all types of abdominal wall hernias
- Describe key steps and technical pearls for safe anastomosis including intracorporeal suturing and the latest staple technologies.
- Describe key components of the GERD evaluation from endoscopy to surgery.
- Define the latest treatments for patients who cannot tolerate oral nutrition including feeding tubes and esophageal stents.
- Discuss the various current and future minimally invasive approaches and critical steps for safe cholecystectomy
- Define the crucial steps for safe minimally invasive distal pancreatectomy and splenectomy
- Describe key steps and technical pearls for safe minimally invasive colon resection including indications for cancer.

Who Should Attend

This CME activity is designed for **General Surgeons, Gastrointestinal Surgeons, Colorectal Surgeons, and Gastroenterologists** interested in the latest developments in laparoscopy, flexible endoscopy and endoluminal surgery of the upper and lower GI tract as well as current trends in minimally invasive cancer surgery. Laboratory sessions will be tailored to individual interests and needs.

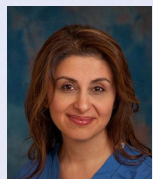
